Abstract

Over the last 40 years, father involvement, broadly defined, among resident and nonresident fathers has increased as women's labor force participation increased and men's roles in the home shifted from being the sole breadwinner to include sharing daily care of the child with the mother (Bianchi, 2000; Cabrera, 2010). Consequently, more men today than in recent decades are hands-on involved in the care of their children (Bianchi, 2011).
